Turnbuckle Loop Trail is a 4 mile moderately trafficked loop trail located near Buckeye, Arizona that features beautiful wild flowers and is rated as moderate. The trail offers a number of activity options and is accessible year-round. Dogs are also able to use this trail but must be kept on leash.

## Did You Know?

**A Chuckwalla:**

**is a large lizard (up to 1.5 feet long) with a long thick tail.**

**is active during the day in open, rocky areas.**

**eats leaves, buds, flowers, and fruit.**

**needs sun to warm itself to 100 degrees or more.**

**can shed its tail when in danger and regrow over time.**
